SUMMER CAMPS FOR KIDS & TEENS (ages 5-15)

SUM01–Global Art & Drama – June 15–19, 9am–3pm – ages 6–10 – (min 7; max 15) – \$250*

Instructor: Seth Eisen

Take a trip around the globe and learn fun arts, crafts, songs, movement, and dances from Africa, Asia, and the Americas. We'll start our day with a fun yoga practice, and then we'll do wild mask making, costumes, and musical instruments, leading us into song and easy and fun dances. This will be an exciting voyage around our amazing planet for girls and boys alike! We'll finish the week with a short show we'll put on for our family and friends. No experience necessary. ***Plus materials fee: \$10.**

SUM02–Draw from Life/Imagination I – June 22–26, 10am–12pm – ages 6–10 – \$75*

SUM03–Draw from Life/Imagination II–June 29–July 3, 9am – 12pm – ages 11–15 – \$110*

Students will be guided through several drawing experiences to develop perceptual skills and “look” at the world around them, learning to recognize, depict, and draw what they see and what they imagine. Students will identify and practice basic principles of art: line, shape, color, texture, value, and space. Projects will include using charcoal, oil pastels, and colored pencils. ***Plus materials fee: \$5.**

SUM04–Ceramics/Mosaics for Kids I – July 6–10, 9am–12pm – ages 6–12 (min 6; max 6) – \$140*

SUM05–Ceramics/Mosaics for Kids II – July 13–17, 9am–12pm – ages 6–12 (min 6; max 6) – \$140*

The class begins with designing a mosaic on paper, followed by making glaze bisque tiles with vibrant colors and unique designs. Next the students will assemble a 10” x 10” wooden frame, glue the mosaic together, and complete with grout. Students are encouraged to bring small objects that hold personal meaning to incorporate into their mosaics. Other ceramic projects will incorporate slab, coil, and pinch techniques. Use your imagination with these techniques to build imaginary creatures and sculptures. All ceramic projects will be colorfully glazed and fired. ***Plus materials fee: \$10.**

SUM06–Robotics – July 13-17, 1–4pm – ages 9–15 (min 7; max 12) – \$140*

Students make a Tail Dragger robot along with a wired controller to make the two independently controlled wheels perform skills in various challenges. We also provide, for in-class use, more powerful Sumo wrestlers, which are slow-moving wire-controlled robots, great for pushing your opponent off the wrestling space. Recycled computer parts are used to create your own inventions. Create a car, a grasping claw, a character, or whatever your imagination and design inspiration can produce.

SUM07–Kids’ Painting Studio – July 20–24, 9am–12pm – ages 5–12 (min 6; max 15) - \$140*

Kids, learn how to paint! Express yourselves through the process and flow of painting what you see and what you imagine. Learn the principles of brush painting techniques and how to mix primary and secondary colors on your palette. Both acrylics and watercolors will be taught. ***Plus materials fee: \$10.**

SUM08–Pop Art Stencil Class – July 27–31, 9am – 12pm – ages 5–12 – (min 6; max 15) - \$140*

Techniques in stencil cutting and paint mixing will be displayed in a series of “pop art” style portraits. Students will use a palette of bright colored paint and use popular culture icons as their subject matter. A brief study of the history of pop art will also be covered. ***Plus materials fee: \$5.**

SUM09–Stop Motion and Clay Animation –July 27–31, 1–4pm– ages 7–14 – \$140*(min 7; max 12)

Students work on individual and team projects to create video animations using small objects, hand-drawn images, and modeling clay to create their animated stories. Storyboarding, stop motion video, armatures, clay modeling, and designing backgrounds are concepts that will be used in this class. Students can also create mechanical animation objects such as Thaumatrope, Phenakistoscopes, Zoetropes, hand-drawn image Flip books, and Kaleidoscopes. ***Plus materials fee: \$5.**

SUM10–3-D Art Adventures – August 3–7, 10am–12pm – ages 6–10 (min 8; max 15) – \$75*

Explore the three-dimensional art form of sculpture by creating simple carvings, shaping air-dry clay, building people, animals, and monsters out of recycled materials, and much more!

WEEKLY CLASSES FOR TEENS & ADULTS

SUM11–Introduction to Crochet & Soft Sculpture – adults 18 and over

2 weeks, June 1, 3, 8, 10 – Mon. & Wed. 7:30–8:30pm (min 5; max 10) – \$40

Basic crochet stitches and decreases will be demonstrated as well as how to follow a pattern to make a soft sculpture. Bring an “H” crochet hook and four-ply yarn. Learn to design your own soft sculpture.

SUM12–Ceramics for Teens & Adults—all levels

6 weeks, June 9–July 21 (no class June 23) – Tues. 7–8:30pm (min 4; max 6) - \$140*

Instructor: Michael de Leon

Receive an introduction to basic hand-building techniques, including slab, coil, and pinch pots. Learn wheel throwing and glazing. Projects will be provided, but the instructor is also available to assist self-directed students. Unlimited lab time included. ***Plus materials fee: \$10.**

SUM13–Contemporary Landscape Painting—teens & adults/beginners

6 weeks, June 27–Aug. 1 – Saturdays, 1–4pm (min 6; max 15) – \$175

This course is for beginning painters who wish to develop the art of landscape painting. Students will learn the basics of composition development and color theory. Classes will be taught in an indoor classroom setting with one outdoor landscape painting class, date TBD. Fine art critique and demonstrations will be given. Use the medium of your choice. Demonstrations will be in acrylic, but adaptable techniques for other mediums will be given. Materials list provided upon registration.

SUM14–Abstract Painting – Teens & Adults/all levels

6 weeks, June 17–July 22 – Wednesdays, 7–9pm (min 6; max 15) – \$125

This class will explore the fundamentals of abstract painting. Students will build upon their understanding of abstract’s unique visual language while exploring form, color harmony and composition. The history of abstract painting will be touched upon while studying various abstract techniques. Fine art critique and class demonstrations will be given. Use the medium of your choice. Demonstrations will be in acrylic, but adaptable techniques for other mediums will be given. Materials list upon registration.

SUM15 – INTRODUCTION TO PRINTMAKING FOR ADULTS

6 weeks, June 13–July 25 (no class July 4) - Saturdays, 12–4 p.m. (min 3; max 4)

Students will experiment with a variety of processes, including monotype, collagraph, block printing, and chine colle. All materials will be provided.
